This position will co-teach our Farm Friends Afterschool Club, ages 5-8. Educator will be paid monthly with an hourly rate starting at \$20/hour based on experience.

Minimum Requirements:

- 21 years or older
- Experience caring for young children
- Extremely reliable and the ability to work desired hours
- Two references and a cleared back-ground check
- Comfortable with extended time outdoors in all weather conditions
- Comfortable handling or the desire to handle farm animals, including chickens and goats
- Excellent communication skills with children and adults, including verbal and written
- Ability to create and teach activities and lessons with children
- Ability to lift 40-50 pounds
- Ability to attend occasional professional development trainings and be first-aid certified or wilderness first-aid certified
- Willingness to self-reflect and revise lessons based on success and student interest
- Skilled in managing risk and supporting young children's risky play

- An interest in the outdoors and knowledge of our local ecosystem or farm and garden concepts.

Our outdoor living classroom includes a nature play area, a large garden, and a greenhouse. Also accessible on our property is a wild fort building area next to the goat barn and chicken coop.

As a nature school Worms and Wildflowers students will spend most of their day outside. Outside time, along with a Reggio Emilia inspired curriculum, will allow children to experience a deep and personal connection with the outdoors, their own learning, and the community. On any given day you may see children taking self-calculated risks, including digging in the mud, jumping in puddles, climbing in trees, creating with sticks, or petting goats!
